BIG DREAMS. BIG ACHIEVEMENTS.

Academics are the backbone of any successful university. Since offering its first courses in 1973, UHV has responded to the academic needs of both its students and the community by providing quality higher education opportunities. The university's talented faculty, staff and students dream big and set about achieving those dreams. Here are some examples of those achievements from UHV's four schools in 2007-2008:

School of Arts & Sciences:

- The American Book Review, an internationally distributed literary journal, continued to bring award-winning authors to Victoria. The UHV/ABR 2007-2008 Reading Series featured Chitra Banerjee Divakaruni, Dagoberto Gilb, R.M. Berry, Robert Phillips, Thomas Williams, David M. Oshinsky, Lance Olsen and Farnoosh Moshiri. The journal also was featured during a reading at the New York Public Library.
- The Society for Critical Exchange, a scholarly society devoted to theory, found a new home at UHV, and the university announced that the independent, alternative press Fiction Collective Two would move to UHV in the fall of 2008.

School of Business Administration:

- The Princeton Review rated the UHV School of Business Administration second on its list of Greatest Opportunities for Minority Students, while Entrepreneur Magazine highlighted SoBA's Master of Business Administration as one of the Top 5 Greatest Opportunities for Minorities.
- SoBA's Master of Science in Economic Development and Entrepreneurship degree was named one of two finalists for the U.S. Association for Small Business and Entrepreneurship 2008 Outstanding Specialty Entrepreneurship Program award.
- GetEducated.com rated SoBA's Strategic

MBA and Global MBA in its list of the top 30 high-quality, low-cost MBA options.

- Professor Nagarajan Ramamoorthy received a Fulbright award to lecture and conduct research in Bulgaria.
- A paper co-authored by professor Stephanie Solansky received the 2007 Best Paper Award from the Academy of Management Journal, one of the top five most influential management publications.

School of Education & Human Development:

- For the second consecutive year, the School of Education & Human Development earned a 99 percent pass rate on the TExES exams, the statewide tests required for teacher certification. These results again placed UHV in the first quartile of institutions in the state for completion year 2007.
- A graduate certificate program in Adult and Higher Education was developed and implemented.
- The first SoEHD students with Master Mathematics Teacher certifications graduated in the spring.
- The faculty achieved a five-fold increase in scholarly publications and a 50 percent growth in the number of conference papers presented.

School of Nursing:

- The nursing program received approval from the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board to become a School of Nursing.
- The School of Nursing held its first-ever Pinning Ceremony for students who received a Bachelor of Science in Nursing.
- The School of Nursing began classes during the spring semester for its new Master of Science in Nursing and received approval in July of 2008 to begin offering a Second Degree Bachelor of Science in Nursing program in Sugar Land in the fall.

Both the university and community dreamed of having athletics at UHV and then showed their support when that dream became a reality by filling the ballparks whenever the Jaguars softball and baseball teams played. The student athletes made UHV proud with their successes both on and off the field. Whether it was the baseball team's 29-5 record or the softball team's mentoring work in the Victoria Independent School District, the inaugural season was a success on all levels. Here are some other athletic highlights:

- Baseball finished its season with a 29-5 record.
- Softball finished the regular season with a 30-16 record and was ranked 15th in the final National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics poll.
- Softball advanced to the NAIA Region VI Softball Tournament and ended its season with an overall record of 32-18.
- Jaguar Jersey tradition started.
- Softball was named a 2007-2008 NAIA Scholar Team for maintaining a team GPA above 3.0.
- UHV announced that it would host the Association of Independent Institutions 2009 Baseball Championship Tournament April 29-May 2, 2009.
- The softball team mentored students in the Victoria Independent School District.
- Softball players Stephanie Lavey, Kristen Lindley, Cirby Ryan and Lauren Garza were named to the National Fastpitch Coaches Association NAIA Southwest All-Region First Team.
- Head softball coach Keri Lambeth and her staff tied for the National Fastpitch Coaches Association NAIA Southwest Regional Coaching Staff of the Year.

Whether UHV was sending students to Mexico, Spain or London to study abroad, developing partnerships to attract international students to the university, or encouraging community members to take Spanish classes, the dream of providing more international opportunities came true in 2007-2008 with the start of several new programs. Here are some of the highlights:

- The university signed partnership accords with five Chinese universities so that Chinese students can earn their Global Master of Business Administration from UHV.
- A visiting professor from the Universidad Internacional in Cuernavaca, Mexico, offered Spanish language classes to area community members and students.
- UHV began a Spanish Language and Culture Program for Professionals that lasts two to five weeks in either Cuernavaca, Mexico, or Granada, Spain.
- UHV attracted an international student, Leonardo Garcia of Venezuela, to play on its first baseball team.





UHV and the community have formed a partnership to increase the quality of life in South Texas. Donations made in 2007-2008 to help achieve those dreams totaled \$754,348. Sixty-six percent of UHV faculty and staff participated in the annual campaign and contributed \$45,140 of the total amount raised. More highlights that illustrate how UHV and the community work together in supporting common dreams include:

- The community's generous giving allowed UHV to provide programs that benefited everyone. Here are some of the grants received in 2007-2008:
 - A \$25,000 grant from the Greater Texas Foundation funded the Generation Proud Scholarship Program to assist first-generation college students.
 - A \$492,672 grant from the Greater Texas Foundation funded Access to Success, a program designed to help alleviate the state teacher shortage.
 - A \$10,000 grant from the National Endowment for the Arts helped pay to bring nationally known authors to Victoria for the UHV/American Book Review Spring Reading Series.
- The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board gave UHV approval to move ahead with planning the new South Texas Regional Center for Economic Development, which will house

many of the region's economic growth agencies in order to expand the business base in 13 South Texas counties.

- The Small Business Development Center began keeping regular office hours in surrounding communities to provide convenient, one-on-one business counseling.
- UHV partnered with the American Productivity and Quality Center to provide the Texas Principal Excellence Program to help more than 300 principals across the state learn leadership and management skills.
- UHV reached out to school-age children and hosted a softball camp, the Friday Fractions and More Math Camp, and the DNA, Genetics and Forensics Camp.
- UHV involved the Hispanic community through:
 - Its role in Hispanic Heritage Month activities. Events included a parade and festival, a mariachi concert and art exhibit.
 - Fiesta Day, which featured dancing, singing, food and information about how to attend UHV.
 - An enhanced Letting Education Achieve Dreams (LEAD) program to help educate students and their families about the value of getting a higher education.

UHV's revenue in 2007-2008 was estimated at \$38.3 million, and UHV spent 53 percent, or \$20.2 million, of that on providing quality instruction to help students achieve their dreams. Financial assistance given to students was \$13.8 million, an increase of 32.6 percent from 2003-2004. UHV also continues to set records with enrollment increases. Statewide, total enrollment at Texas public universities grew 3 percent from fall of 2004 to fall of 2007 at a time when UHV enrollment increased 13.2 percent. The university hit an enrollment milestone in the fall of 2008 by attracting 3,173 students. This marked the first time UHV enrolled more than 3,000 students since the university started in 1973. Since its beginning, UHV has awarded 10,478 bachelor's and master's degrees. Below are some of the key financial and enrollment figures for UHV:



UHV's revenue in 2007-2008 was estimated at \$38.3 million, and UHV spent 53 percent, or \$20.2 million, of that on providing quality instruction to help students achieve their dreams. Financial assistance given to students was \$13.8 million, an increase of 32.6 percent from 2003-2004. UHV also continues to set records with enrollment increases. Statewide, total enrollment at Texas public universities grew 3 percent from fall of 2004 to fall of 2007 at a time when UHV enrollment increased 13.2 percent. The university hit an enrollment milestone in the fall of 2008 by attracting 3,173 students. This marked the first time UHV enrolled more than 3,000 students since the university started in 1973. Since its beginning, UHV has awarded 10,478 bachelor's and master's degrees. Below are some of the key financial and enrollment figures for UHV:
