President's Message

Dear Friends of UHV,

The 2018-2019 year was one of expansion for the University of Houston-Victoria, not only with construction projects and new buildings for future generations, but also with our community partnerships and the way we were able to help students advance in their lives and careers.

I hope you will enjoy this online annual report that allows us to make information about the year available to a wide audience and to feature videos and highlights from the Nov. 12 President's Annual Report & Excellence Awards event.

Here are just a few of UHV's highlights from 2018-2019:

- The **M.G. and Lillie A. Johnson Foundation** gave \$1.5 million to the university, the largest donation in our history, to help build out and equip state-of-the-art labs that will be in the university's new Science, Technology, Engineering & Mathematics Building under construction and the former Town Plaza Mall building being renovated.
- UHV broke ground on both the **STEM Building** and the **former Town Plaza Mall** building and celebrated with a "topping out" ceremony for **Don & Mona Smith Hall**, our new three-story, 280-bed residence hall scheduled to open in fall 2020.
- We opened **University Commons**, the university's new three-story, 80,124-square-foot student center and the location of our new library serving UHV and Victoria College students in addition to the community.
- **UHV Katy** moved into a new academic building shared with the University of Houston and continued to offer transfer and graduate programs to Greater Houston students looking for quality, affordable education located close to where they live and work.
- We welcomed new UHV leadership, including **Chance Glenn Sr.**, provost and vice president for academic affairs, and **Ken Colwell**, dean of the School of Business Administration. We also announced the hiring of **Jose Cantu** as our new vice president for enrollment management.
- Readers of the Katy Times newspaper voted UHV the **Best College in Katy** for the fourth year in a row, while readers of Living Magazine named UHV the **Best College or University in Katy and Fulshear**.
- UHV partnered with **San Antonio Independent School District** to identify up to 10 graduating seniors each fall and provide these "SAISD Scholars" with extensive advising and financial support to attend UHV as freshmen.

- **Crossroads Bank** donated \$300,000 to the university over 10 years to support the expansion of UHV athletics. The gift, the largest cash donation ever in support of UHV athletics, also designates the bank as a UHV Athletics Sponsor for each of the university's sports throughout the academic year from 2019 to 2028.
- For the second year in a row, UHV set a **fundraising record** by raising \$3,245,449 in donations during the fiscal year that came from 1,303 unique donors, including 618 alumni.
- The UHV Student Government Association led an initiative that resulted in a referendum supported by students to assess themselves a \$125-a-semester fee to help finance the university's **first recreation center**. Students voted 3-to-1 to approve the fee, which began in fall 2019 and applies to students who live within 50 miles of the Victoria campus.
- A \$100,000 donation from the **Rebuild Texas Fund** via the **Qatar Harvey Fund** provided scholarships to students still struggling with the aftereffects of Hurricane Harvey.
- Numerous national organizations ranked UHV for our quality and affordable **degree programs**.

Because of the expansion we experienced this year in all areas and the legacy UHV is leaving in the communities it serves, our theme for the annual report is **Expanding Our Legacy**.

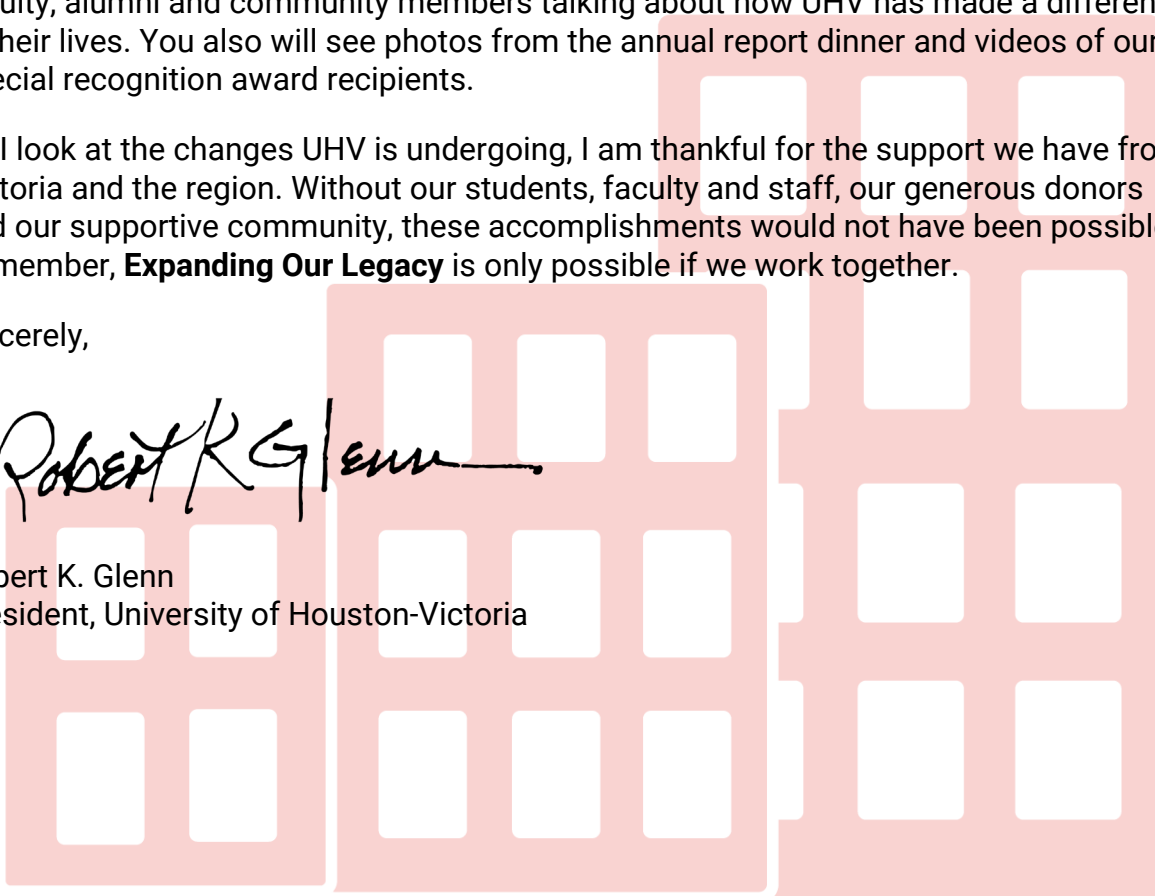

Innovate

Academics

Each year, UHV's three schools create innovative academic programs and make improvements to better meet the needs of the university's students and the community.

Here are just some of the academic highlights from UHV's three schools that took place in 2018-2019:

School of Arts & Sciences

- A \$30,000 grant from Alcoa Foundation allowed the university to continue its popular mathematics, robotics and computer science classes, camps and events, and helped the university offer the Texas Women in Computing Summer Camp for middle school girls for the first time. An additional \$7,500 grant to support the summer camp came from the Dow Chemical Co. Foundation to purchase portable computers and a portable computer station.
- A \$10,000 grant from the National Center for Women & Information Technology supported university programs to increase enrollment, retention and graduation of women majoring in undergraduate computer science degrees.
- For the first time, the UHV/American Book Review Reading Series showcased three UHV faculty members. They were Diana Lopez, an associate professor and director of the undergraduate creative writing program; Anthony Madrid, an assistant professor and director of the Master of Fine Arts in creative writing program; and Saba Razvi, an assistant professor of English and creative writing. The series started in 2006 and has brought more than 120 authors to Victoria for community readings, books signings, workshops with UHV and high school students, and receptions.
- The Master of Fine Arts in creative writing program was recognized by two national ranking organizations for its quality and affordability. It was ranked the sixth most affordable online M.F.A. in creative writing by College Factual based on the university's accreditation and affordable tuition. OnlineMasters.com ranked the degree 13th in the nation and gave the online program special recognition for its technology support.

School of Business Administration

- Chinese businessman Bingxin Wu donated \$700,000 to the university over a 10-year period to improve programs, research and international business studies for business students and faculty. Wu, who previously was awarded an honorary Doctor of Humane Letters from UHV, also donated \$600,000 to the university five years ago.
- Wu's donations helped sponsor 13 graduate and undergraduate students' two-week summer abroad trip to China, where they learned about the history and culture of the country and met and traveled with Chinese students. UHV students were joined by Chinese students from the Central University of Finance and Economics School of Government and the

International University of Business and Economics in Beijing. Nearly 100 UHV students have traveled to China since the summer study abroad program started.

- Undergraduate business students helped create a social media plan for the UHV Small Business Development Center. The winning team members got to present their plan at the regional Small Business Association conference and attend a Victoria Leadercast event hosted by the SBDC.
- OnlineMasters.com placed UHV's Strategic and Global Master of Business Administration degrees in human resource management and Strategic MBA in international business on its lists of the best online MBAs in the nation for their affordability, academic quality and student success. Undergraduate degrees receiving rankings included the Bachelor of Business Administration in finance, which was ranked third in the nation by College Factual for its affordability and accreditation, and the B.B.A. in general business with a supply chain management concentration, which was listed among the top 25 online programs in the nation by GuidetoOnlineSchools.com. The School of Business Administration is accredited by AACSB International – The Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business, which accredits less than 5 percent of business schools worldwide.

School of Education, Health Professions & Human Development

- The national Council for Accreditation of Counseling & Related Educational Programs awarded eight-year re-accreditations to UHV's two degrees in its graduate counseling education program. The university offers the only CACREP-accredited Master of Education degrees in school counseling and clinical mental health counseling in the Victoria and Greater Houston areas.
- The university revamped its online VOICE program, which allows those who are interested in teaching but have a bachelor's degree in another field to earn a teaching certificate in as little as a year. The changes make the program more affordable and give students the option of applying credits toward earning a master's degree.
- A \$100,000 grant awarded by Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Texas to the University of Houston Foundation funded a yearlong community-based program led by two UHV faculty members that focuses on ways to reduce chronic kidney disease in at-risk populations.
- UHV began coordinating a \$109,800 contract with the Texas Education Agency to review lesson proposals and select the ones included in a new free, online database of lesson plans and accompanying videos for teachers in pre-kindergarten through 12th-grade classrooms.



Partner

Community Partnerships

Each year, community members and businesses give to and partner with UHV to create a legacy of opportunities that benefit everyone.

UHV received more than \$3 million in donations in 2018-2019, an all-time fundraising record for the university. Donations came to the university through 1,575 gifts from 1,303 unique donors, including individuals, alumni, university employees and students, foundations and corporations. For the fourth consecutive year, alumni participation was the highest on record, and more than half of full-time UHV employees made donations to the university.

Here are some examples of community partnerships that took place in 2018-2019:

- The University of Houston Foundation received a \$35,000 grant from the American Red Cross in support of the UHV Relief Fund to help students still recovering from Hurricane Harvey.
- Former UHV President Vic Morgan and jaX, UHV's jaguar mascot, competed against each other to see who could raise \$1,000 first to rappel down the side of One O'Connor Plaza in downtown Victoria. The donations benefited three Victoria nonprofits: the Hispanic Council of Victoria, Challenged Athletes Dream Complex and Victoria Business and Education Coalition.
- Community members attended a two-part homelessness symposium hosted by the UHV School of Education, Health Professions & Human Development. The symposium featured a panel discussion and presentations by area homeless advocates.
- UHV hosted the 32nd annual Martín de León Symposium on the Humanities. The theme was "Comida, Café, y Cultura," meaning food, coffee and Mexican American culture.
- The International Youth Foundation presented UHV with a \$33,504 grant to host International Festival events in Karnes City and Cotulla high schools. The foundation also awarded UHV a second grant of \$38,501 to fund a Breakfast with the Stars outreach program in schools in DeWitt, Karnes and LaSalle counties.
- UHV hosted Black History Month events, including the A.D. Sheffield Symposium on African American History. The symposium featured a presentation about difficulties faced by African Americans during the Reconstruction Era in Texas and a performance by KoumanKe'le', an African dance group out of Houston.
- The top three winners of a Black History Month Poster Contest for area fifth-graders were awarded UHV scholarships and vouchers to Victoria College summer camps. The theme for the contest was "Local Black Leaders." The winners were honored at a poster contest reception, and the 114 participants' posters were displayed in the UHV University Center

throughout February. The contest was a partnership between UHV, Victoria College and the Victoria Black History Committee Inc.

- UHV International Programs hosted its fourth International Festival, featuring free food, music, dances, traditional clothes and booths with poster presentations from 17 countries. The festival was supported by the International Youth Foundation, Victoria Northside Rotary Club, UHV Student Life and the UHV School of Arts & Sciences.
- Four permanent plaques were added to the UHV Donor Recognition Display in University North to honor the Trull Foundation, Rebuild Texas Fund, Bennett-Wood family, and Claud and Mary Virginia Jacobs for their gifts of \$50,000 or more to the university. The university also updated the donor feature portion of the wall to highlight alumna Josie Rivera, and the university updated the Cornerstone Circle with the names of those who donated \$1,000 or more in 2017-2018.
- Motivational speaker Tyson Dever, who survived a wreck caused by a distracted driver, gave a community presentation at UHV during Distracted Driving Awareness Month.
- The UHV School of Education, Health Professions & Human Development hosted the Victoria Crossroads Council for Mathematics and Science Educators Conference. It was attended by 85 educators and students, and offered 44 different presentations by UHV pre-service teachers.
- More than 150 students from 10 area high schools took part in the 24th annual UHV Mathematics & Robotics Awareness Day, and the top performers in math and computer science tests each received a trophy and an iPad tablet.
- The UHV Small Business Development Center and School of Business Administration hosted a Victoria webcast of Leadercast, a worldwide leadership conference, and the SBDC hosted its second Leadercast Women conference. Leadercast's theme was "Leading Healthy Teams," and the theme for Leadercast Women was "Lead Yourself."
- UHV University College hosted its first Undergraduate Research Showcase, featuring presentations from students about biology, mathematics, criminal justice and the humanities.
- The first Victoria Generals collegiate wooden bat league home game of the summer was sponsored by UHV. The university gave away free tickets for community members to attend the game. Fans also took home UHV giveaways, took part in contests between innings and had photos taken with jaX.
- Crossroads Community Band partnered with UHV to record the music for the "UHV Alma Mater."
- ConocoPhillips presented a \$2,000 grant to the UHV Center for Regional Collaboration and the Small Business Development Center to work with the DeWitt County Texas Rural Leadership Program.

- The UHV Library hosted “Grant Funding Workshop: Find Funders and Write Successful Grants” to help area nonprofit organizations learn how to write effective grant proposals and find funding.
- The UHV School of Education, Health Professions & Human Development presented a fall symposium featuring Randy Guttenberger, author of “Managing Your Crazy Self!: Turning Your Turbulence Into Tranquility.” He gave a presentation about mental health and managing the brain.





Thrive

Student Affairs

UHV offers plenty of activities, programs and learning experiences outside of the classroom so that students thrive during their college experience. These activities take place both on and off campus.

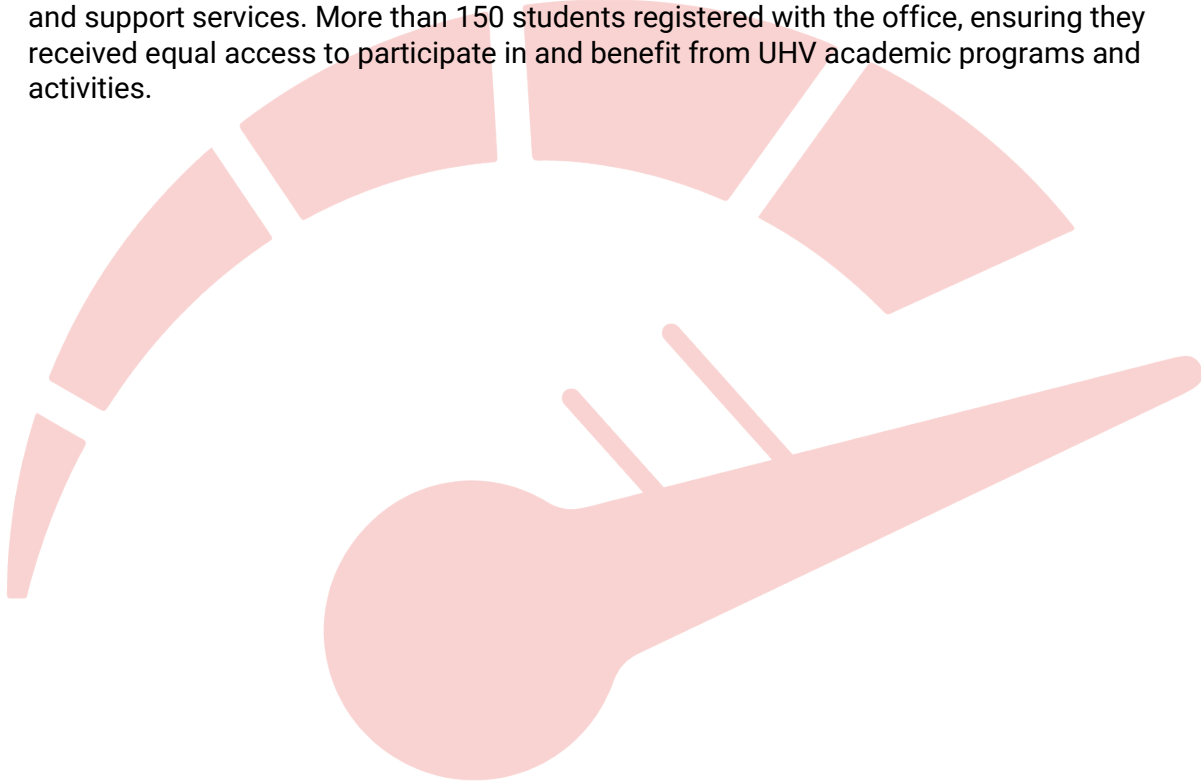
In 2018-2019, more than 75 students learned leadership skills at the fifth annual ROAR Leadership Conference. Several students also earned certifications in the ROAR Certified Leader program, which encourages students to think critically about their leadership skills and how those skills could impact their future careers.

Students gave back by participating in the fifth annual Alternative Spring Break trip to Biloxi, Miss., and several local service projects during National Volunteer Week. These included volunteering in Victoria at the Dorothy O'Connor Pet Adoption Center, Retama Manor South and the Food Bank of the Golden Crescent.

Here are some more Student Affairs highlights from the year:

- Career Services assisted more than 400 students with job searches and career coaching through individual sessions. The office also hosted 37 career-related programs, job fairs and workshops.
- JP's Market, a free food pantry and career closet open to UHV and Victoria College students, had another successful year thanks to support from the Food Bank of the Golden Crescent. The initiative served 433 students and provided 13,417 pounds of food.
- UHV hosted its fourth annual Family Weekend. Collaborating with university departments, student organizations and the City of Victoria, more than 400 students, their families, and university faculty and staff enjoyed two days of activities that included a magic show; the President's Picnic, featuring food, games, inflatables and music; and Bootfest in downtown Victoria.
- Residence Life started the year at 98 percent occupancy in the university's residence halls, the highest occupancy rate ever and a 1 percent increase from the previous year.
- UHV held its fourth annual homecoming week. The week featured a tailgate, kickoff concert, alumni banquet, talent show, capture the flag football game and dance. The '90s theme was "Keepin' It Fresh at UHV."
- Participation in intramural sports grew with the continuation of the Cross Campus Challenge: Battle for the Cup. More than 200 students from UHV and VC competed on flag football, volleyball, basketball and soccer teams. VC won the traveling trophy.
- Residence Life started using new housing operations software that allowed for increased resident engagement and interaction through a new housing portal.

- Thirty-five UHV students registered to vote in Victoria County or took a mail-in form during National Voter Registration Day, and 110 students registered to vote on National Constitution Day.
- Ninety percent of returning students living in the residence halls used a new room selection lottery system.
- Students traveled to the Capitol in Austin to meet with legislators to discuss UHV's budget request for the upcoming biennium.
- Seventy-eight percent of UHV students living in university housing stated that they were satisfied with their residential living experience in a Quality of Residential Life Survey. This was well above the national average.
- Student Life provided more than 170 activities for students, including more than 20 multicultural events. This included the university's first poetry slam and open mic night featuring poet Ashlee Haze and UHV students. The event was held during Women's History Month.
- The Counseling Center saw an increase in student appointments from the prior academic year and hosted more than 50 programs related to substance abuse, and mental, physical and sexual health.
- Ten student organizations were chartered during the annual Student Organization & Leadership Banquet. UHV now has 40 officially chartered student organizations with more forming as interest groups.
- Disability Services continued to see a rise in students receiving academic accommodations and support services. More than 150 students registered with the office, ensuring they received equal access to participate in and benefit from UHV academic programs and activities.

Athletics

UHV's student-athletes continued to drive the university's athletics legacy both on and off the field.

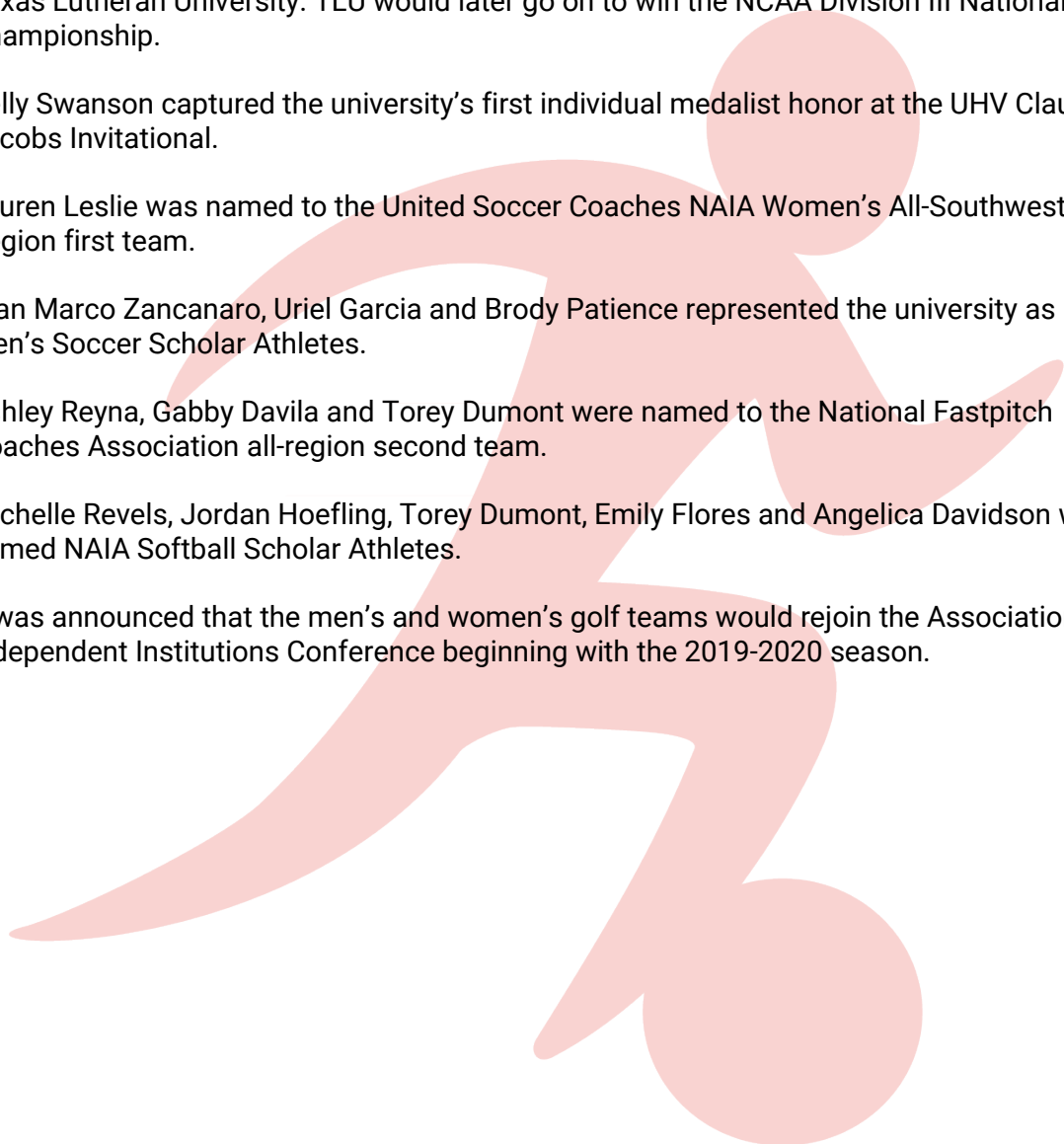
The softball team won its second Red River Athletic Conference regular season title in three years and made its seventh appearance at the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics Championship Tournament. The men's golf team won its fourth straight PGA Works Golf Championship, the fifth in six years for the Jaguars, and its second straight South Padre Island Invitational title. In soccer, the men's team advanced to the RRAC semifinals, while the women's team battled to the RRAC quarterfinals.

The university's student-athletes also were recognized for their excellence in the classroom with 62 of them, or nearly 50 percent, named RRAC Scholar Athletes.

Here are some more of the year's highlights for the Jaguars:

- UHV began the year by being named an NAIA Champions of Character Five-Star Institution.
- A record 39 student-athletes were named to the Fall 2018 UHV President's and Deans' lists, while 31 were recognized on the Spring 2019 President's and Deans' lists.
- The softball team collected its 11th season of 30-plus wins.
- The 2019 UHV Athletes of the Year were softball player Torey Dumont and soccer player Palemon Plancarte.
- The softball team knocked off the top-ranked University of Science and Arts of Oklahoma in the semifinals of the Dodge City Bracket of the NAIA Opening Round but came up short for a trip to the NAIA World Series after losing twice to USAO in the finals.
- The softball team finished No. 19 in the NAIA poll and was ranked as high as No. 11 during the season after compiling a record 20-game winning streak.
- Michelle Revels was named to the Google Cloud College Sports Information Directors of America Academic All-America softball second team and all-district first team.
- The RRAC Freshman of the Year in baseball was pitcher Bailey Kolb, while Joshua Fonseca represented UHV on the RRAC second team.
- The RRAC Defensive Player of the Year in softball was Torey Dumont, while Emily Flores, Michelle Revels, Peyton Branham, Gabby Davila and Kelsey Tidrick were named to the RRAC first team and Ashley Reyna to the second team.
- Ryan Morant was named to the RRAC all-conference men's golf team.

- Lauren Leslie was named to the RRAC women's soccer second team, while Jurnee Fernandez and Zuzelane Sanchez received honorable mentions.
- Brody Patience, Brandon Watts and Connagh Wilks represented UHV on the RRAC men's soccer first team, while Jose Munoz was named to the second team, and Gian Marco Zancanaro and Palemon Plancarte received honorable mentions.
- The men's soccer team fell to Louisiana State University of Alexandria 3-2 in the RRAC semifinals with Brody Patience and Sydney Tume being named to the all-tournament team.
- The women's soccer team battled LSUA to a 0-0 draw in the RRAC quarterfinals, forcing a penalty kick shootout that the Jaguars eventually lost 5-4.
- The men's golf team earned a No. 21 ranking in the Bushnell Golfweek NAIA Coaches Poll.
- Golfer Corey Rodriguez claimed individual honors in the South Padre Island Invitational.
- UHV softball swept a doubleheader from National Collegiate Athletic Association Division III Texas Lutheran University. TLU would later go on to win the NCAA Division III National Championship.
- Kelly Swanson captured the university's first individual medalist honor at the UHV Claud Jacobs Invitational.
- Lauren Leslie was named to the United Soccer Coaches NAIA Women's All-Southwest Region first team.
- Gian Marco Zancanaro, Uriel Garcia and Brody Patience represented the university as NAIA Men's Soccer Scholar Athletes.
- Ashley Reyna, Gabby Davila and Torey Dumont were named to the National Fastpitch Coaches Association all-region second team.
- Michelle Revels, Jordan Hoefling, Torey Dumont, Emily Flores and Angelica Davidson were named NAIA Softball Scholar Athletes.
- It was announced that the men's and women's golf teams would rejoin the Association of Independent Institutions Conference beginning with the 2019-2020 season.

Cesar Gonzalez and **Sophia Solano** were named UHV Homecoming king and queen.

The Numbers

UHV's operating revenue in Fiscal Year 2019 was estimated at \$71.9 million, and UHV spent 81 percent, or \$58.3 million, of that total on providing student access and success. Financial assistance awarded to students totaled \$42.9 million, a 22.3 percent increase from Fiscal Year 2015. UHV's official enrollment in fall 2019 was 4,501, a 2.7 percent increase from the previous fall. Since its beginning in 1973, UHV has conferred 21,492 bachelor's and master's degrees with 1,486 students earning more than one degree from the university. 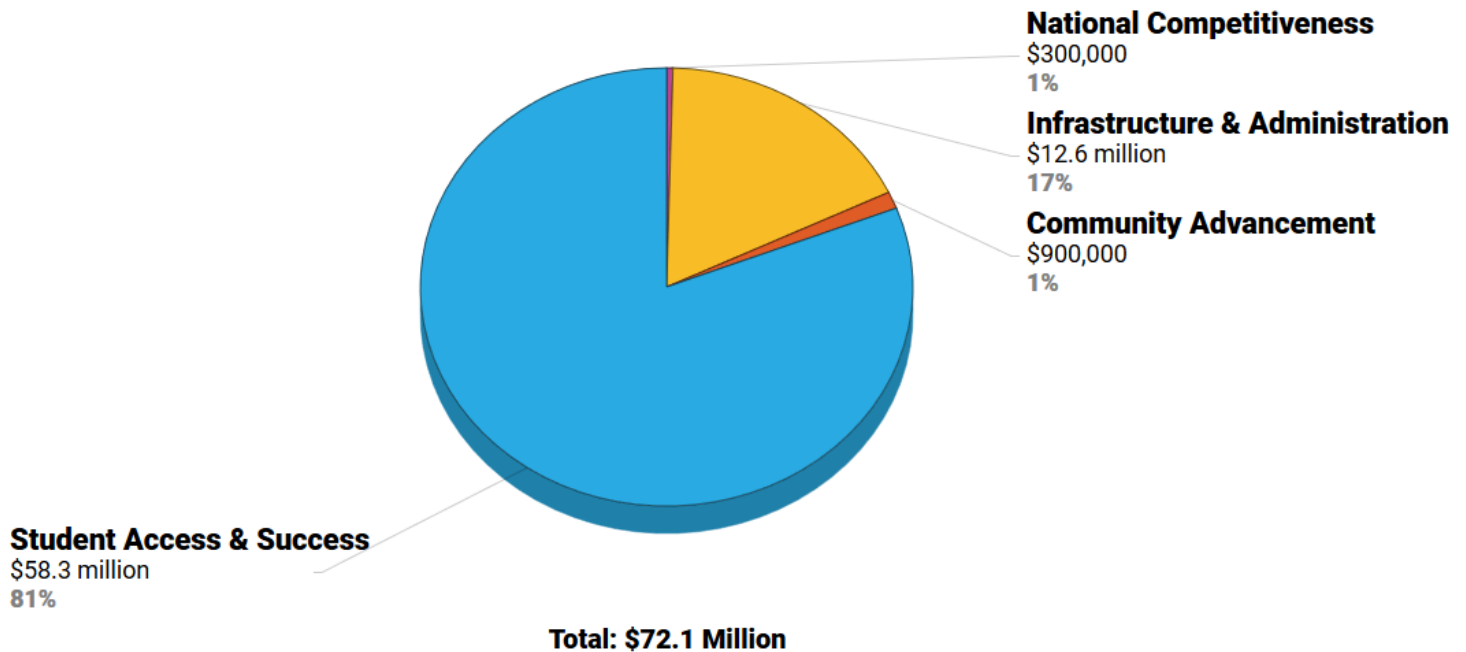

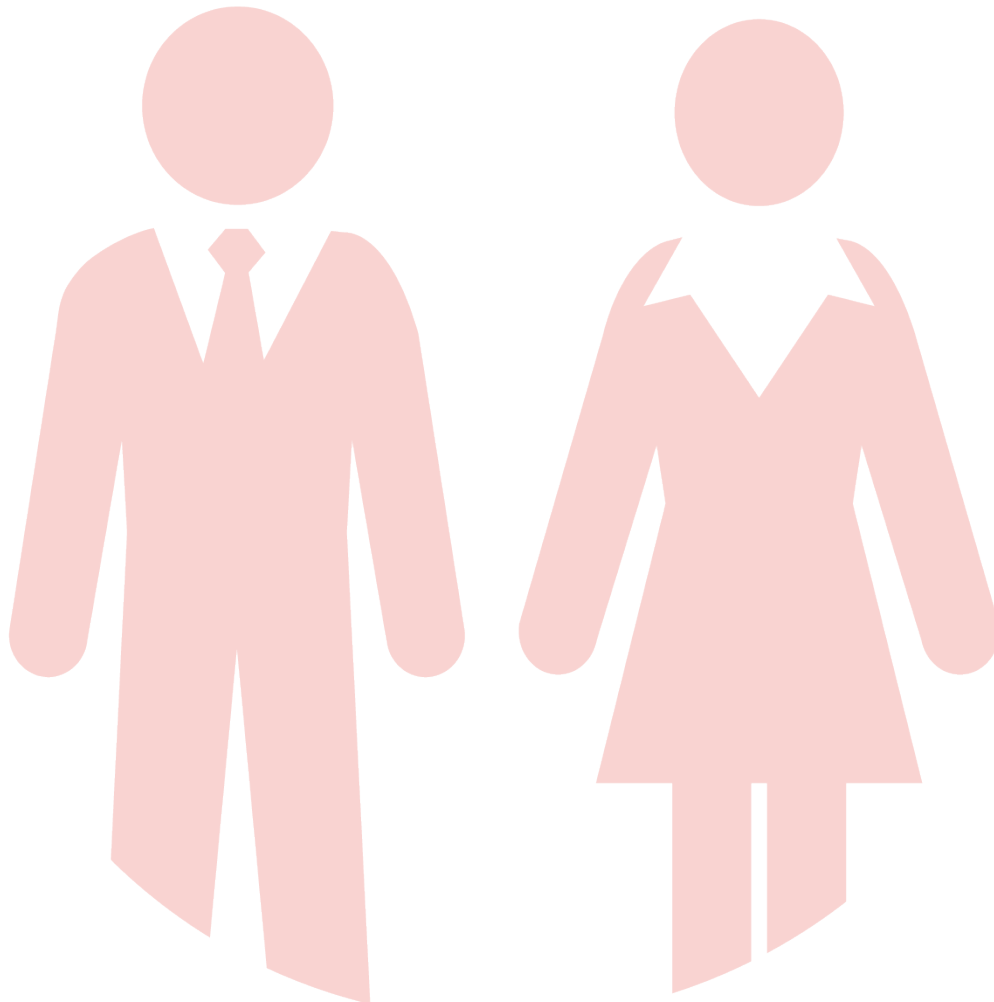
