

2020-2021 President's Annual Report & Excellence Awards



Dear Friends of UHV,

The 2020-2021 year continued to challenge the University of Houston-Victoria and the communities we serve as we worked from home, taught or took online classes, attended virtual events, wore masks and socially distanced.

Despite the changes we all faced, there were many bright spots throughout the year as we opened two new buildings, offered new degree concentrations, partnered with the community on projects and helped students move toward their goal of earning a degree.

I hope you will enjoy this online annual report that allows us to make information about the year available to a wide audience. We also have featured videos and highlights from the Nov. 9 President's Annual Report & Excellence Awards program.

Here are just a few of UHV's highlights from 2020-2021:

- The M.G. & Lillie A. Johnson Foundation committed to providing \$2 million for the university's first student recreation and health center. The gift, the largest in the university's history, will help fund construction of the center along with a student fee that UHV students voted in December 2018 to approve.
- We opened two new buildings: University South, which is dedicated to science, technology, engineering
 and mathematics programs, and UHV Northwest, home of the UHV Small Business Development Center,
 Center for Regional Collaboration, Athletics and the university's kinesiology program.
- UHV announced that it would be showcasing the work of Houston artist Tom Sayre with the upcoming
 outdoor installation of "Contemplation," a painted steel sculpture that is part of the Public Arts of the UH
 System collection.
- Readers of Living Magazine voted UHV the Best College or University in Katy and Fulshear for the third
 consecutive year, while Katy residents voted UHV as a top college choice in the 2021 Katy Times' Best of
 Katy contest.
- Representatives from UHV and Harmony Public Schools signed a partnership agreement to streamline admission, provide scholarships and offer resources for Harmony students attending UHV after high school graduation.
- The university announced its new **UHV Commitment** housing scholarship, which is renewable for up to four years for new and returning full-time students who live on campus.
- UHV joined more than 60 institutions participating in the 2021-2022 OpenStax Institutional Partner
 Program to provide students with openly licensed college textbooks offered free online or low cost in
 print.

- The UHV Diversity and Race Task Force launched its first initiative, the CommUNITY Book Club, a
 collaboration between the university, United Way of the Crossroads, Be Well Victoria Coalition and the
 Center for Peace that encourages community members to read and discuss books written by diverse
 authors about race and diversity. It also established the UHV Library Fund for Diversity Resources to
 support the purchase of literature representing diverse authors and experiences.
- Donors contributed \$2,896,065 to the university throughout the year, including more than \$400,000 for Kay's Grove, a campus memorial landscape garden being constructed in honor of Kay Kerr Walker, a former member of the UH System Board of Regents and longtime supporter of the UH System and UHV.
- Numerous state and national organizations ranked UHV for our quality and affordable degree programs.

Because of the way UHV and our area communities continued to push forward through the challenges that we experienced this year, our theme for the annual report is **Up to the Challenge**.

As you look through this website, be sure to view the short videos featuring students, faculty, alumni and community members talking about how UHV has made a difference in their lives. You also will see videos of our special recognition award recipients.

As I look at the changes at UHV this past year, I am thankful for the support we have from Victoria and the region. Without our students, faculty and staff, our generous donors and our supportive community, these accomplishments would not have been possible. We are all definitely **Up to the Challenge** of making this region a better place to live, work and play.

Each year, UHV's three schools are up to the challenge of creating new academic programs and make improvements to better meet the needs of the university's students and the community.

Here are just some of the academic highlights from UHV's three schools that took place in 2020-2021:

School of Arts & Sciences

- A \$198,028 U.S. Department of Defense National Defense Education Program for STEM grant was awarded to UHV for a two-year project in collaboration with Alabama A&M and Navajo Technical universities. The project is helping UHV students interested in science, technology, engineering and mathematics prepare for internships and technical careers in national security and defense.
- The Specialist in School Psychology program was awarded a national accreditation that is helping UHV
 recruit new students and streamline the professional certification process for the program's graduates.
 The accreditation through 2028 from the National Association of School Psychologists makes UHV one
 of only 13 universities accredited in Texas.
- The school announced it would begin offering new degree concentrations in the latest technologies for
 its students majoring in computer information systems. Students earning a bachelor's degree now can
 select from concentrations in cybersecurity or data science, while graduate students can choose from
 cybersecurity, data science or artificial intelligence concentrations.
- Free, virtual courses and camps for middle and high school students interested in science, technology, engineering and mathematics were offered throughout the year. These courses and events included a Data Science Summer Camp and an after-school Robotics, Programming and Simulation Course, both for high school students, and a Texas Women in Computing Summer Camp for middle school girls. Many of the events were funded by a \$30,000 grant from Alcoa Foundation.

School of Business Administration

- The "Bridge to Brilliance Building Resiliency to Inspire, Develop and Grow Entrepreneurship" virtual
 monthly series was launched by a subcommittee of the school's Dean's Advisory Board to connect UHV
 students with area business owners and interested community members. The free presentations featured
 speakers followed by a discussion period about topics such as financial literacy, networking strategies
 and how to expand career opportunities.
- The Strategic Master of Business Administration was recognized as a top program when the Princeton Review included it in its list of Best Business Schools 2021: Best On-Campus MBA Programs. The list included schools worldwide and was determined using factors such as institutional data and student surveys. The school also ranked No. 7 in the Greatest Resources for Minority Students category.
- The Houston Business Journal ranked the Strategic MBA on its list of 2021 Largest Houston Area MBA programs. The Strategic MBA is offered online and face to face at the UHV main campus in Victoria and the UHV Katy instructional site.

• Ten alumni representing different business professions spoke to students virtually during the school's 11th annual **Alumni Week** about their professional journeys and how to be successful.

School of Education, Health Professions & Human Development

- The school's graduate counseling program updated its degree offering to a Master of Science in
 Professional Counseling with tracks in clinical mental health counseling and professional school
 counseling. The change from a Master of Education to a Master of Science was made to increase
 professional opportunities for students after graduation. The degrees are nationally accredited by the
 Council for the Accreditation of Counseling & Related Educational Programs and are the only CACREPaccredited professional counseling degrees available in the Victoria and Greater Houston areas.
- Twelve UHV alumni were named teachers of the year for their outstanding work at their respective schools in the Victoria Independent School District. The school offers 11 certifications for students who want to become teachers.
- The Victoria Alliance Against Chronic Kidney Disease Program, which focuses on ways to reduce chronic kidney disease in at-risk populations, held meetings online because of the pandemic and then expanded with a new program called "Getting Better, Together." The new program focuses on improving area residents' mental health and is led by two UHV faculty members. Both programs are funded by a grant from Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Texas.
- A virtual pinning ceremony was held for the first time for 11 students graduating from the Registered Nurse to Bachelor of Science in Nursing program. Students were sent a unique UHV nursing pin to wear on their lapels to let patients know that well-educated nurses are caring for them. Nursing Schools Almanac, a national nursing website, also recognized the program as one of the best in Texas.



STUDENT AFFAIRS & ATHLETICS

UHV offers plenty of activities, programs and learning experiences that challenge students to grow and have fun outside of the classroom.

In 2020-2021, more than 85 students learned leadership skills at the seventh annual **ROAR Leadership Conference**, which was held virtually. In addition, 15 students – the most since the program started in 2017 – earned certifications through the **ROAR Certified Leader** program, which encourages students to think critically about their leadership skills and how those skills could impact their future careers.

A new position in Student Affairs, the **assistant director of diversity and inclusion**, was created to implement new university diversity, equity and inclusion initiatives, including the formation of a **Multicultural Advisory Council**, a student organization open to all UHV students. The assistant director also started a monthly virtual Brave Space Series, created a Diversity & Inclusion campus newsletter, and facilitated more than 40 programs, including the first RISE Diversity Conference and a First-Gen Panel.

Here are some more Student Affairs highlights from the year.

- Students gave back to the community by donating blood through the South Texas Blood & Tissue Center, helping in the UHV Community Garden and participating in several service projects during National Volunteer Week, including volunteering at the Food Bank of the Golden Crescent.
- Career Services assisted more than 450 students with job searches and career coaching through individual sessions. The office also hosted job fairs and presented more than 20 workshops virtually to classes about topics related to resume writing, career planning and personal branding.
- Residence Life opened its newest suite-style residence hall, Don & Mona Smith Hall. Named in honor of
 the university's provost emeritus, Don Smith, and his wife, Mona, the three-story, 280-bed residence hall
 features 76 suites with two different floor plans. Smith Hall has a common kitchen area and a study room
 with a computer lab for students. The laundry area is located on the first floor along with a TV and gaming
 lounge that exits into an outdoor courtyard.
- JP's Market, a free food pantry and career closet open to UHV and Victoria College students, had another successful year thanks to support from the Food Bank of the Golden Crescent and donations from students, faculty, staff and the community. The initiative served 280 students and provided 11,900 pounds of food. In response to COVID-19, JP's Market increased the days it was open while implementing social distancing protocols and creating an online ordering system. The market also recently moved to a larger location in Jaguar Hall.
- UHV hosted its first virtual **Homecoming Week** with the theme "Jaguars Stay HOMEcoming." The week included a virtual kickoff, yoga, a game night, a career panel, the sixth annual talent show and more.

- Despite the pandemic, Student Life was able to provide more than 120 activities for students, including
 virtual events, social media challenges and in-person passive programs while enforcing social distancing.
 Some activities included virtual trivia and movie nights, Fitness Fridays and challenges, Involvement Fairs
 and Holiday Specials.
- The Counseling Center hosted more than 50 educational programs related to mental, physical and sexual health, and reducing substance abuse. The center also expanded services for students with medical, mental health, economic, social and behavioral needs through interventions, referrals and follow-up services.
- The eighth annual **Student Organization and Leadership Awards** were announced virtually for the second year in a row. During the event, several new student organizations were chartered.
- **Disability Services** continued to see a rise in students receiving academic accommodations and support services. More than 165 students registered with the office, ensuring they received equal access to participate in and benefit from academic programs and activities.
- **Shuttle Services** provided transportation to more than 10,000 individuals during the academic year and accommodated more than 20 special services trips outside of normal operations.
- **Testing Services** served 525 unique visitors during the academic year in both Victoria and Katy. Services included coordinating exams with departments at UHV, education companies and government agencies.
- Five summer ROAR Orientation sessions were offered virtually: three for first-year students, one
 for transfer students and one for UHV Katy students. A new initiative, the ROAR First-Year Festival,
 welcomed 100 first-year students and family members to campus. The festival included live music, panel
 discussions, a resource fair, campus walking tour, city shuttle tour, giveaways, food and opportunities for
 first-year students to complete last-minute to-do items.
- After being held virtually the previous year, Jaguar Journey Welcome Weekend was attended by 120 firstyear students Friday through Sunday before the fall 2021 semester started. Events included presentations
 about different departments, group time with orientation leaders, campus tours, a panel discussion about
 relationships and sexual misconduct, campus tag, big money bingo, evening entertainment, a rep your
 group competition and a closing ceremony.

Athletics

UHV's student-athletes and Athletics staff were Up to the Challenge to represent the university during a year that saw all six teams compete in the spring because of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Three of the Jaguars teams won conference tournaments and advanced to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics National Championships.

Men's soccer won its second consecutive regular season Red River Athletic Conference Championship and earned the No. 1 seed in the conference tournament. The Jags lost in the semi-finals. Men's soccer has gone two straight conference seasons without a loss, a streak that stands at 15 games going into 2021.

Victoria played host to the Association of Independent Institutions Conference Golf Tournaments. Home course advantage held true as the Jaguars men's and women's golf teams won their respective tournaments to advance to the **NAIA National Championships**. The men competed in the program's first-ever national championship and finished 14th. The women's team made its second appearance at nationals and finished 30th.

The softball team won the RRAC tournament to advance to the NAIA National Championship Opening Round, and for the first time in program history, the team won the opening round bracket to advance to the **NAIA Softball World Series**. The Jags dropped the opening game and won the next game, but the run ended with a 3-1 loss to Bethany College. The Jags finished the season ranked 19th in the NAIA.

Off the field, a record number of the university's student-athletes were recognized for their excellence in the classroom with 80 Jaguars named **RRAC Scholar Athletes**.

Here are some more of the year's highlights for the Jaguars:

- Fifty-six student-athletes were named to the Fall 2020 **UHV President's and Deans' lists**, while 43 were recognized on the Spring 2021 lists. To qualify, students must have a minimum 3.5 GPA.
- Defender Connagh Wilks and forward Karlo Lopez were recognized on the NAIA Men's Soccer All-America honorable mention soccer team.
- Wilks also was named RRAC Defensive Player of the Year while Lopez was voted the RRAC Newcomer of the Year, and both made First-Team All-Conference. Also named to the RRAC All-Conference First Team were soccer players Gian Marco Cordoba, Oliver Nugent and Brandon Watts, while Adrian Rodriguez, Sebastian Leal and Winner Assi were named to the second team.
- Head coach Adrian Rigby was named the **RRAC Men's Soccer Coach of the Year** for the second straight year and picked up his 100th career coaching victory in men's soccer with a 2-1 win over Texas A&M-Texarkana.
- The baseball team entered the RRAC Baseball Championship as the fifth seed, losing to eventual
 conference champion LSU-Shreveport in the semifinals.
- The men's golf team achieved its highest ever regular season ranking, No. 17, in the NAIA coaches' poll.
- Softball player Ashley Reyna was named the RRAC Co-Defensive Player of the Year and to First Team All-Conference, while Marisa Mendoza and Kaylle Acosta were named to the first team, and Cameron Cowan was named to the second team.
- Reyna also was named to the NFCA All-Region first team, while Acosta was named to the second team.
- Baseball coach Terry Puhl collected his 300th career coaching win a 5-4 win over Loyola-New Orleans.
- Sports information specialist Paul Ebner was named the **RRAC Sports Information Director of the Year**, and head trainer Thomas Pribyl was named the **RRAC Athletic Trainer of the Year**.
- Athletic Director Ashley Walyuchow was selected as president of the NAIA Athletics Directors
 Association.
- Michelle Kristoff and Will Paton were named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District NAIA first team in softball and golf, respectively.

Emi Ruiz (2021) was recognized with the "Unsung Leader" award from the Texas Association of Diversity Officers in Higher Education.

Noemi Bustamante, **Dominic Flores** and **Eli Juma** were named Royal Jaguars during UHV's 2021 Jaguars Stay Home(coming) celebration.

Diane Kliem (1992) and **Michael Cavanaugh** (2005) were named to the UHV President's Regional Advisory Board.

Trang Huynh was selected for a 10-week internship with the Pacific Northwest National Laboratory, one of the U.S. Department of Energy's laboratories.

Beverly Bellot, **Daniel Perez**, **Pavithra Sivashanmugam** and **Andrew Tomek** were named Outstanding Students as part of the university's new Academic Affairs awards.

Faculty & Staff Achievements

Tara Vaughn was named the M.G. & Lillie A. Johnson Foundation Endowed Professor of Nursing, a professorship intended for a doctoral-prepared Registered Nurse who has a Master of Science in Nursing and is a full-time UHV faculty member.

Esther Cuenca was awarded the 2021 Van Courtlandt Elliott Prize from the Medieval Academy of America for her academic essay "Town clerks and the authorship of custumals in medieval England."

Brandon Lee was elected as incoming president of the Kiwanis Club of Victoria.

The UH System Board of Regents named retired UHV professors **Hal Smith** and **Meledath Damodaran** as professors emeriti. The title of professor emeritus is given to retired faculty members by their colleagues to honor their service to the university and their profession.

Mark Ward's publication, "Sermons as Social Interaction: Pulpit Speech, Power and Gender," received two awards for Article of the Year from the Religious Communication Association and the Spiritual Communication Division of the National Communication Association. He also presented his research about religious communication and media at the National Communication Association annual convention.

Abran Rodriguez was the recipient of a \$2,170 Chi Sigma Iota Excellence in Counseling Research Grant for wellness counseling research for his study titled "The Essential Self: Gay Men's Perceptions of Spirituality, Gender Identity, Cultural Identity and Self-Care."

Hardik Gohel was awarded UHV's 2021-2022 Internal Research Grant. He also joined UH's Hewlett Packard Enterprise Data Science Institute as a faculty researcher of data science and artificial intelligence. In addition, a research article Gohel cowrote, titled "Electrochemical SARS-CoV-2 Sensing at Point-of-Care and Artificial Intelligence for Intelligent COVID-19 Management" was recognized by the World Health Organization and listed on the organization's COVID-19 Global Literature on Coronavirus Disease webpage.

The university received a total of four prestigious ADDY awards for creative excellence from the Corpus Christi Chapter and District 10 of the American Advertising Federation. The awards included the Best of Sales & Marketing award and a Gold ADDY from the AAF-Corpus Christi Chapter for a UHV Athletics campaign promoting the 2020 Weekend for the Jaguars. The pieces were designed by Larzell Cowan. The campaign also received a Gold ADDY in the four-state AAF-District 10 competition. In addition, the university won a Bronze ADDY from the AAF-Corpus Christi Chapter in the Cross-Platform Integrated Advertising Consumer Campaign category for pieces for the 2019-2020 UHV President's Annual Report & Excellence Awards. Those who worked on the pieces included George Rodriguez, Marci Wallace, Cowan, Aby Gonzalez, Katie Wilson, Kelsey Mills and Enkeleta Dervishi.

Michael Wiblishauser co-authored the medical research paper "COVID-19 Vaccination Hesitancy in the United States: A Rapid National Assessment" in the Journal of Community Health, a national academic journal.

Kayla Sappington was named the 2020 UHV Employee of the Year.

UHV Junior Faculty Summer Research Grants were awarded to **Esther Cuenca** and **Laura Mammina**.

Shannon Viola and **Elise Hendricker** wrote a column about UHV's Specialist in School Psychology program that was featured in the Texas Association of School Psychologists' winter newsletter.

Sandy Venneman and **Yixi Ning** were granted faculty development leave for the academic year. Venneman is researching student learning anxieties and academic integrity, while Ning is researching the long-term trends of executive compensation in large corporations.

Kyle Schlesinger was nominated to be the 2021-2022 State Poet Laureate.

UHV Academic Affairs started an annual awards program to recognize outstanding university faculty, staff and students. Recipients included Willie Black, Outstanding Junior Faculty Member; Elise Hendricker, Faculty Mentor of the Year; Jennifer Ortiz-Garza, Above and Beyond Award; Yun Wang and Rhiannon Smith, Outstanding Administrative Leaders; Jennifer Reeder, Outstanding Advisor; and Kendra Matthews, Outstanding Office Staff Member.

Mark Martinez received the State Star Award from the South-West Texas Border Small Business Development Center Network.

Brooks Sterritt published his first novel, "The History of America in my Lifetime."

Ricardo Teixeira and **Jang Woo Park** published their book, "Mathemagics: A Magical Journey through Advanced Mathematics," through World Scientific Publishing.

James Williams received certification as a Texas Commission on Fire Protection-Fire Inspector I and II.

Daniel White received the UHV Teaching Excellence Award.

Gen Kaneko was awarded the UHV Research and Scholarly Activity Excellence Award.


Ricardo Teixeira was the recipient of the UHV Distinguished Faculty Service Award.



UHV's operating revenue in Fiscal Year 2021 was estimated at \$80.1 million, and UHV spent 83 percent, or \$66.2 million, of that total on providing student access and success. Financial assistance awarded to students totaled \$45.8 million, a 22.6 percent increase from Fiscal Year 2017. UHV's fall preliminary enrollment was 4,359. Since its beginning in 1973, UHV has conferred 23,973 degrees with 1,901 students earning more than one degree from the university. Below are some key financial and enrollment figures for UHV:

COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS

Each year, community members and businesses rise to the challenge to give to and partner with UHV to create opportunities that benefit everyone.

In 2020-2021, UHV was fortunate that 1,088 unique donors contributed to 97 scholarship funds, academic programs, construction and building projects, and other initiatives. Gifts totaling \$2,896,065 ranged from \$1 to \$2 million, the largest gift in the university's history. In addition, the second-largest number ever of UHV faculty and staff made financial contributions to the university with 225 employees making a gift.

Here are some examples of community partnerships that took place in 2020-2021:

- The second annual UHV History Day featured keynote speaker Hilary Green, an associate professor of history at the University of Alabama and a Vann Professor of Ethics in Society. She gave a free, virtual lecture titled "Confederate Monument Removals: Contextualizing the Post-George Floyd Moment."
- The UHV Library hosted events for students and the community to draw attention to national Banned
 Books Week. Events included a Virtual Read Out that featured videos posted on social media of
 employees reading from challenged and banned books. Blind Date with a Banned Book encouraged
 library patrons to check out books that were wrapped in brown paper with only the genre and the reasons
 the book was censored or banned written on the outside.
- UHV served as an **early voting site** for the first time as a convenience to both students and community members ahead of the 2020 general election.
- The **Albert and Mary Dick Charitable Trust** made two donations totaling \$15,000 to the UHV Student Emergency Fund, which provides grants to students experiencing sudden hardships that could prevent them from staying in school. Students must apply for assistance, and grants are for \$300 or less.
- The UHV Small Business Development Center used funds provided by the federal coronavirus aid bill
 to offer a free Master Class virtual series to help area small business owners learn ways to have their
 businesses survive and thrive during the pandemic.
- For the first time, UHV Career Services partnered with Townsquare Media, a radio, digital media, entertainment and digital marketing solutions company, to provide internship opportunities for students majoring in communication.
- The UHV Center for Regional Collaboration partnered with Texas Rural Funders and Connected Nation Texas on a project to help rural communities in DeWitt, Lavaca and Refugio counties get broadband internet service for their residents.
- Faculty, staff and students volunteered throughout the spring to help the Victoria County Public Health Department provide **COVID-19 vaccine clinics** at the Victoria Community Center. Volunteers greeted people, provided clerical support and directed attendees to vaccination stations.

- The top three winners of the annual **Black History Month Poster Contest** for area fifth-graders were awarded UHV and Victoria College scholarships and swag bags. The theme for the contest was "Black Politicians: Then and Now." Prizes and certificates were delivered to the top winners at their respective schools. The contest is a partnership between UHV, VC and the Victoria Black History Committee.
- The Cuero Community Foundation made a \$5,600 donation to the university to provide scholarships for Cuero High School teachers to take graduate courses so that they would be certified to teach UHV dualcredit courses to their students.
- UHV International Programs hosted a free, virtual version of its annual International Festival, showcasing
 different countries, cooking demonstrations and crafts from different cultures to community members,
 and UHV faculty, staff and students.
- A new internship agreement with **Citizens HealthPlex** fitness and wellness facility allowed students studying kinesiology to gain real-world experience in exercise science careers.
- More than 60 graduating students brought their families to campus for the Jaguar Ring Celebration,
 where they had photo opportunities with celebratory signs, the UHV mascot and the box that held the
 class rings after it was blessed by jaX, the university's real-life jaguar mascot at the Texas Zoo. Students
 also got to take home a swag bag with custom-made UHV cookies and dunk their hands in a mixture of
 red dye and water from the Guadalupe River to turn their hands red for 24 hours to signify their time at
 UHV.
